Assessments

The Rediscovery of North America, Barry Lopez

Performance: Authentic Task

Students read the essay in advance of class discussions. Discussion format is Harkness Table. Students are instructed in the methods and requirements of the discussions format and are assessed for leadership and participation as defined in the grading rubric.

Oral Presentation of a Moral Dilemma

Oral: Presentation

One student each day will present a current moral dilemma from a media source. The presentation
will follow the DISORDER method of case analysis and is to last 5-10 minutes. Students may have
notes, but are to speak with knowledge and confidence on their topic. At the end of the
presentation, all students are given the opportunity to ask information, clarifying, or challenge
questions.
Êssay Test

Test: Written

In class essay exam requiring full written responses to selected questions on the topic of environmental ethics. Some questions refer directly to the reading for the unit, some refer to the documentary, and others are more general.
